Tests

Test dates will be announced well in advance. Students who are absent the day before a test must take the test with the rest of the class. Students who are absent on the day of the test must take the test after school on a day agreed upon by the student and teacher.

Missed Work

If you are absent, homework due the day you missed is due upon your return to school. You will have one week from the day you return to hand in any homework assigned on the day(s) of your absence. You will also have one week to make up any missed labs. This can be done at a time agreed upon by you and me (before or after school). If you have not made up missed work after the week, your work will be considered late.

Late Work

A 25 point penalty will be assessed on all late work.

Interventions

Students with a class average below 70% will be assigned mandatory enrichment. Students who fail to show mastery on tests (70%) will be assigned mandatory enrichment.

Students who fail to complete assignments and have zeroes in the grade book will be assigned mandatory enrichment until all missing assignments are complete.

PowerSchool

Parents and students can access student grades in PowerSchool. Grades will be updated weekly in PowerSchool.

Cell Phone Policy

Cell phones are a huge distraction during class. You don't need to be actively using your phone for it to divert your attention during class. You cannot afford to be distracted during this class. Cell phones must be turned off (or at least silenced) and put away (PGHS Policy). I have a cell phone storage unit in the classroom for anyone who will be too tempted by their phone when it is nearby. Phones will remain put away until permission is granted to use the phone (or class ends). I expect phones to be put up when directed to do so. Students must submit cell phones before leaving class to use the restroom (PGHS Policy).

Scholarly Integrity

It is expected that the work you do will be your own, whether on a test, quiz, homework, or lab report. When you collaborate in groups, you are expected to discuss ideas and help each other to clarify your understanding of concepts. You may collect data together on labs. However, when you write down answers to questions, they should be your own answers, reflecting YOUR understanding and knowledge. Copying someone else's work is called cheating; it is not allowed and will earn <u>all</u> participants a <u>ZERO</u> on the assessment.
